1 A MEMORIAL

2 DECLARING JANUARY 24, 2012 AS "4-H DAY" AT THE SENATE.

4 WHEREAS, 4-H has been a premier youth leadership  
5 organization in New Mexico for more than eighty years; and

6 WHEREAS, 4-H sponsors clubs in rural and urban areas  
7 throughout the state; and

8 WHEREAS, more than sixty thousand youth between the ages  
9 of five and twenty-one years old participate in 4-H youth  
10 development programs statewide; and

11 WHEREAS, 4-H youth development programs are diverse and  
12 help participants acquire important life skills, including  
13 leadership, responsible citizenship, critical thinking,  
14 problem-solving, decision-making, conflict resolution and  
15 communication skills, that directly contribute to the  
16 successful transition of young people into productive adults;

18 WHEREAS, 4-H participants report having greater  
19 confidence and a more positive self-identity, stating that  
20 they have greater control over events in their lives and a  
21 better ability to make decisions on their own, that they set  
22 goals and take responsibility for their actions, that they  
23 can take pride in many things and that their lives have  
24 purpose and meaning;


25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE

6 development organization. \_\_\_\_\_


