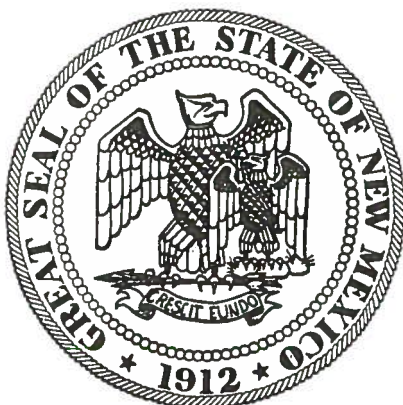

1 AN ACT

2 RELATING TO EDUCATION; CLARIFYING THAT COUNSELORS ARE ELIGIBLE
3 FOR LEVEL THREE LICENSURE SALARIES.

4
5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

6 SECTION 1. Section 22-10A-11 NMSA 1978 (being Laws
7 2003, Chapter 153, Section 42, as amended) is amended to read:

8 "22-10A-11. LEVEL THREE LICENSURE--TRACKS FOR TEACHERS,
9 COUNSELORS AND SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS.--

10 A. A level three-A license is a nine-year license
11 granted to a teacher who meets the qualifications for that
12 level and who annually demonstrates instructional leader
13 competencies. If a level three-A teacher does not demonstrate
14 essential competency in a given school year, the school
15 district shall provide the teacher with additional
16 professional development and peer intervention during the
17 following school year. If by the end of that school year the
18 teacher fails to demonstrate essential competency, a school
19 district may choose not to contract with the teacher to teach
20 in the classroom.

21 B. The department shall grant a level three-A
22 license to an applicant who has been a level two teacher for
23 at least three years and holds a post-baccalaureate degree or
24 national board for professional teaching standards
25 certification; demonstrates instructional leader competence as

1 required by the department and verified by the local
2 superintendent through the highly objective uniform statewide
3 standard of evaluation; and meets other qualifications for the
4 license.

5 C. With the adoption by the department of a highly
6 objective uniform statewide standard of evaluation for level
7 three-A teachers, the minimum salary for a level three-A
8 teacher for a standard nine and one-half month contract shall
9 be as follows:

10 (1) for the 2003-2004 school year, thirty
11 thousand dollars (\$30,000);

12 (2) for the 2004-2005 school year,
13 thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000);

14 (3) for the 2005-2006 school year, forty
15 thousand dollars (\$40,000);

16 (4) for the 2006-2007 school year,
17 forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000); and

18 (5) for the 2007-2008 school year, fifty
19 thousand dollars (\$50,000).

20 D. The minimum salary for a counselor who holds
21 the highest ranked counselor license as provided in Chapter
22 22, Article 10A NMSA 1978 and rules promulgated by the
23 department shall be the same as provided for level three-A
24 teachers pursuant to Subsection C of this section.

25 E. A level three-B license is a nine-year license

1 granted to a school administrator who meets the qualifications
2 for that level. Licenses may be renewed upon satisfactory
3 annual demonstration of instructional leader and
4 administrative competency.

5 F. The department shall grant a level three-B
6 license to an applicant who:

7 (1) holds a level two license and meets the
8 requirements for a level three-A license or who holds a
9 current level two teacher's license and, for at least four
10 years, has held the highest-ranked counselor license as
11 provided in Chapter 22, Article 10A NMSA 1978 and rules
12 promulgated by the department;

13 (2) holds a post-baccalaureate degree or
14 national board for professional teaching standards
15 certification;

16 (3) has satisfactorily completed department-
17 approved courses in administration and a department-approved
18 administration apprenticeship program; and

19 (4) demonstrates instructional leader
20 competence required by the department and verified by the
21 local superintendent through the highly objective uniform
22 statewide standard of evaluation.

23 G. Beginning with the 2007-2008 school year, the
24 minimum annual salary for a level three-B school principal or
25 assistant school principal shall be fifty thousand dollars

1 (\$50,000) multiplied by the applicable responsibility factor.

2 H. By the beginning of the 2008-2009 school year,
3 the department shall adopt a highly objective uniform
4 statewide standard of evaluation, which includes data sources
5 linked to student achievement and educational plan for student
6 success progress, for level three-B school principals and
7 assistant school principals and rules for the implementation
8 of that evaluation system linked to the level of
9 responsibility at each school level." _____
